Dominican Rebels Step Up Assaults On U.S. Positions

SANTO DOMINGO (UPI)—The nearly double the previous day in U.S. military bases Friday night over the past two weeks reported a sharp increase in Dominican rebel attacks on American installations here, U.S. officials said. Heavy forces were reported Friday in Washington, the State Department described the situation as "dangerous."

House K's Sunday Senate Approval Likely Monday

ADROTTA (AP)—The Maine House passed a Sunday House bill today, the Senate's approval of the bill is expected Monday and the question then will go to Gov. Ross.

The governor, who vetoed a similar bill in 1963 as "a matter of conscience" and "infringement on the liberties of the citizenry," has given no indication of his present attitude. There has been speculation that he would approve the legislation, or at least permit it to become law without his signature.

The bill was introduced in 1963 and was reintroduced in 1964. It was passed by the House on Thursday and given to the Senate on Friday. The Senate is expected to act on the bill on Monday.
