WASHINGTON (UPI)—Senate House negotiators Friday revived the \$277 million Dickey-Lincoln School hydro-electric project in Maine as the Northeast's first federal power complex.

The project is proposed to deliver peaking power to power consumers in New England at lower rates than they now pay, according to Interior Department estimates.
